**RESOLUTION OF VIOLATIONS  
NOTICE OF VIOLATION FOLLOW-UP LETTER**

Dear Mr. Son:

On September 18, 2012, the Cleveland Division of Air Quality (CDAQ) inspected Best Dry Cleaner – Bedford Heights (Best Dry Cleaner) located at 25618 Aurora Road in Bedford Heights. On October 1, 2012, CDAQ issued a Notice of Violation (NOV) requiring Best Dry Cleaner to submit a corrective action plan addressing violations from the operation of your emissions unit (EU) D001: Firbimatic perchloroethylene dry cleaning machine.

Specifically, your operation of emissions unit EU D001 was in violation of your permit-to-install (PTI) No. 13-04733, in that the following records were not available for review during CDAQ's inspection:

- Weekly visual inspections of dry cleaning components (Part III. A. III. 1.),
- Weekly temperature measurements of the air-perchloroethylene gas-vapor stream on the outlet side of the refrigerated condenser (Part III. A. III. 2.),
- Perchloroethylene purchase receipts, monthly and yearly perchloroethylene consumption, records of repair, and the amount of fabric dry cleaned using perchloroethylene (Part III. A. III. 3.), and
- Monthly inspection records of perceptible leaks using a halogenated hydrocarbon detector or perchloroethylene gas analyzer while EU D001 is in operation.

On October 12, 2012, CDAQ revisited Best Dry Cleaner at your request to help you better understand the violations cited in the NOV. Records of perchloroethylene purchases, weekly visual inspections and temperature measurements of the refrigerated condenser were recorded for October 2012, to date, in a 2012 *Environmental Compliance Calendar for Dry Cleaners*.



Additionally, a perchloroethylene gas analyzer was on-site and you were in the process of learning how to use it to conduct your monthly inspections. CDAQ also reviewed additional records with you that need to be recorded in the *Environmental Compliance Calendar for Dry Cleaners*.

CDAQ is also in receipt of a letter from you as of October 17, 2012, that states that you are following the requirements of your Ohio EPA permit starting with October, 2012.

Your corrective action plan was received in a timely manner and appropriate steps were taken to bring EU D001 into compliance. CDAQ has determined that no further enforcement action is warranted at this time, but reserves its right to take such action in the future if necessary.

CDAQ issues this letter with Ohio EPA's concurrence and does not excuse any violations of local, state and federal laws or regulations regarding air pollution control. Violations of air pollution control laws may be pursued in local court or referred to Ohio EPA or U.S. EPA for further enforcement action.
