Dear Mrs. Maura LaGreca,

This letter serves as a Notice of Violation to you for the violation of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Rule 3745-77-04(E) associated with the facility ("Permittee") identified above. Specifically, the Permittee did not submit an application to renew its Title V permit to Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) 180 days prior to the permit expiration date (i.e., by 4/24/2009), in violation of OAC Rule 3745-77-04(E) and Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3704.05(J)(2).

This failure to submit a complete and timely application, as defined by OAC Rules 3745-77-04(H) and 3745-77-05, has resulted in the loss of the "application shield" provided by OAC Rule 3745-77-06(A) for this facility. Therefore, continued operation of this facility after the expiration date of the Title V permit, without a valid Title V renewal permit being issued by the Director, will be a violation of OAC Rule 3745-77-02(A) and ORC 3704.05(J)(2) and (K). Be advised that submission of a Title V permit renewal application, will not reinstate the "application shield" provided by OAC Rule 3745-77-06(A) for this facility.


Please submit a complete Title V permit renewal application to Ohio EPA as soon as possible, but no later than 30 days from receipt of this notice. Title V permit applications must be submitted using the eBusiness Center: Air Services (<https://ebiz.epa.ohio.gov>). The submission of the requested permit renewal application does not constitute a waiver of Ohio EPA's authority to seek civil penalties as provided in ORC 3704.06. This matter has been submitted to Ohio EPA's Central Office enforcement committee for resolution of the violations of State law and for a determination of whether or not to pursue civil penalties.
