NOTICE OF VIOLATION: Operating an emission unit without a permit as well as failure to submit quarterly deviation reports and annual volatile organic compound reports

Dear Ms. Campbell:

On March 26, 2013, the Cleveland Division of Air Quality (CDAQ) inspected Pyramid Parts and Services (Pyramid) located at 9501 Allen Drive in Valley View. This letter serves as notification that you are operating a source in violation of the following applicable air statutes, air regulations, or air permit conditions.

From the date of the issuance of the permit-to-operate for Emission Unit (EU) K001: Binks 20-10 floor type spray booth and miscellaneous metal parts coating line consisting of exhaust, fan, lighting filters and exhaust stack on February 20, 2008, until the expiration of the permit-to-operate on February 20, 2013, Pyramid failed to submit annual volatile organic compound emission reports as required by Part II(D) of the permit-to-operate as well as quarterly deviation reports as required by Part I(3). This is a violation of Ohio Administrative Code 3745-15-03 and Ohio Revised Code 3704.05(G).

Pyramid is currently operating Emission Unit EU K001 without a permit. The previous permit-to-operate expired on February 20, 2013, and a renewal application has not been received by CDAQ. This is in violation of Ohio Administrative Code rule 3745-31-02(A)(1)(b) and Ohio Revised Code 3704.05(F).



Unless you undertake some type of corrective action with respect to the above noted violations, you will remain in non-compliance. CDAQ requests that Pyramid submit a permit-to-install/operate application for EU K001 to the following address, within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter:

As well as a corrective action plan outlining the steps that will be taken to ensure all reporting will be submitted to CDAQ as required by any future permit requirements to the following enforcement representative, within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter:

Your written response to this letter must be received by CDAQ within thirty (30) days of your receipt of this letter. If there is insufficient time to correct the alleged violations within this timeframe, your response must include a timeline for correcting the alleged violations.

Please note that all permit applications submitted to CDAQ must include original signatures. Photocopied signatures are not valid; the application will not be accepted by CDAQ and will be returned to you if original signatures are not provided.

Permit-to-install/operate (PTIO) applications may be completed through the Ohio EPA eBusiness Center at <https://ebiz.epa.ohio.gov/>. An account is required to be created and a pin number assigned.

Violations of Ohio air pollution laws and /or permit terms and conditions are subject to the penalties stipulated in Ohio Revised Code Section 3704.99(A), which allows fines of not more than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, for each violation.

Free assistance with state and/or federal regulations, rules, laws or permit conditions can be provided at no charge through the Ohio EPA Office of Compliance Assistance and Pollution Prevention (OCAPP). OCAPP can be contacted at <http://www.epa.ohio.gov/ocapp> or (614) 644-3469 or (800) 329-7518. CDAQ makes no guarantee that the facility will meet the qualifying guidelines established by OCAPP.



OCAPP can also provide assistance to facilities that want to investigate methods of pollution prevention to reduce raw material usage and waste production. Again, there is no charge for their services.

CDAQ issues this letter with Ohio EPA's concurrence. The failure to mention any specific violation does not excuse any violations of local, state and federal laws or regulations regarding air pollution control. Violations of air pollution control laws may be pursued in local court or referred to Ohio EPA or U.S. EPA for further enforcement action.
