NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION
ANTIDegradation**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for the modification of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit (1PK00010) for the discharge from the existing Clermont County Middle East Fork Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant disposal system. The NPDES permit application was submitted by the Clermont County Water and Sewer District, 2381 Clermont Center Drive, Batavia, Ohio 45103.

Clermont County's Middle East Fork Regional preferred wastewater treatment facility alternative submitted for approval is proposed to treat 7,200,000 gallons per day of domestic wastewater. The facility is located at 4409 Haskell Lane, Batavia Township, Clermont County, Ohio. Treated wastewater are proposed to be discharged at the same location. The proposed discharges are to the East Fork of the Little Miami River.

Other wastewater disposal alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality will be considered by Ohio EPA.

The discharges from this facility, if approved, could result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of the East Fork of the Little Miami River. However, the chemical-specific water quality criteria developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in OAC 3745-1, will not be exceeded. In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.

The contents of the above stated application indicates no exclusions or waivers, as outlined by section 3745-1-05 (D) of the antidegradation rule (effective as of October 1, 1996), apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

An Ohio EPA public hearing on the proposed project has been scheduled for Monday, September 9, 2002 at 6:30 pm at the Clermont County Board of Commissioner's Session Room, 3rd Floor, 101 East Main Street, Batavia, Ohio. The public hearing will end when everyone in attendance has had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the project.

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and give written or oral comments on the project and all persons who do so may, in the discretion of the presiding officer, be questioned by other persons present. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain

additional information that will be considered by the Director of the Ohio EPA prior to any further action on the application(s).

OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL RENEWAL HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT

On July 3, 2002, Ohio EPA issued a final renewal Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) to Chemical Solvents, Inc. -Jennings Facility, for its facility at 3751 Jennings Road, Cleveland, Ohio 44109. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD052937885.

Why does Chemical Solvents, Inc. need this Permit for its Jennings Facility?

The Chemical Solvents, Inc.-Jennings Facility is engaged in chemical wholesaling activities. Chemical Solvents, Inc. formerly accepted and stored off-site generated hazardous waste. They no longer accept this waste, and their permitted hazardous waste storage area has been closed. There are no active treatment, storage, or disposal activities at the site. However, Chemical Solvents, Inc. is now involved in corrective action activities. To issue this final Hazardous Waste Permit, Ohio EPA determined that the Hazardous Waste Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards and that the applicant has a history of compliance with relevant environmental laws, and demonstrates sufficient reliability, expertise, and competency to operate a hazardous waste facility under this chapter and Chapters 3704. and 6111. of the Revised Code, all rules and standards adopted under them, and terms and conditions of a hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit, given the potential for harm to the public health and safety and the environment that could result from the irresponsible operation of the facility. The final Hazardous Waste Permit contains the conditions under which the facility must operate. It will allow Chemical Solvents, Inc. to conduct corrective action activities at its Jennings Road facility. It will also require the company to investigate and, if necessary, clean up any contamination of hazardous waste or constituents from waste management units that may be at the facility.

Can I appeal this permit?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than August 3, 2002. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. You must file your appeal, according to Ohio Revised Code § 3745.04 and 3745.07, with ERAC at the following address: ***Environmental Review Appeals Commission***, 236 E. PROPOSED CONSENT ORDER**

The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA") has entered into a proposed Consent Order to resolve all claims alleged in the State of Ohio Counterclaim filed in the Trumbull County Court of Common Pleas, Case Number 2000 CV 02230. The proposed Order would require Plaintiffs Andrew Yount and Margaret Yount and Defendants Theodore Keriotis, Mary Keriotis, Michael Manios, Mary Manios, and Franklin Manios, to construct a sewer line(s) and any other associated improvements to direct the sewage and other waste generated from the Lakeview Manor Apartments, the Suburba Apartments, and any other flow currently or previously directed to the Plaintiffs' wastewater treatment works, to the publicly owned treatment works ("POTW") owned and operated by Trumbull County by constructing and connecting sewer line(s) to the Trumbull County sewers. Plaintiffs are hereby permanently enjoined and ordered to attain and maintain compliance with Ohio's water pollution control laws, R.C. Chapter 6111, for discharges from the wastewater treatment plant ("WWTP") by ceasing any further discharges to waters of the State, and to require the operation of the facility to be in compliance with the applicable requirements of Chapters 3734 and 6111 of the Ohio Revised Code. The proposed Consent Order also requires payment of a \$13,000.00 civil penalty payable to the State of Ohio.

Plaintiffs and Defendants reserve the right to withdraw or alter the proposed Consent Order based on comments received during the public comment period.
