CLEANUP AGREEMENT Krejci Dump Site - National Park Service

Notice is hereby given that on December 11, 2002, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA"), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") Chapters 3734, 3745 and 6111, signed an Agreement with the National Park Service for cleanup of the Krejci Dump Site located in the Cuyahoga Valley National Park, at 814 West Hines Hill Road, Boston Township, Summit County, Ohio (the "Site").

The National Park Service completed a Remedial Investigation (RI) and Feasibility Study (FS) under a 1991 Ohio EPA administrative order, and assumed the role of lead agency at the Site for Remedial Design (RD) and Remedial Action (RA). In November 2001, the NPS issued the Proposed Plan. According to the selected remedy, all debris and soils containing unacceptable levels of contaminants will be excavated and disposed of off-site. The entire disturbed area will be graded and revegetated. Surface water and ground water monitoring will be performed for at least two years following completion of the removal of materials from the Site. On August 6, 2002, Ohio EPA concurred with the Record of Decision ("ROD"), which the Park Service issued on September 27, 2002. Under the Agreement, the Park Service would implement the ROD at the Site.

The execution of the Agreement is a final action of the Director. The action may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission ("Commission") by any person aggrieved or adversely affected. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice or issuance of the action. (See ORC 3745.04 and 3745.07). A copy of the appeal must be served on the Director within three (3) days after the appeal is filed with the Commission. OHIO EPA ISSUES DRAFT RENEWAL HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT

On December 20, 2002, Ohio EPA issued a final renewal hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Permit) to BP Chemicals, Inc, for its facility at 1900 Fort Amanda Road, Lima, Ohio 45802. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD042157644.

Why does BP Chemicals, Inc., need a Permit?

BP Chemicals, Inc., manufactures acrylonitrile, acetonitrile, hydrogen cyanide, acrylonitrile catalyst, and a resin product known as Barex. From this manufacturing process, hazardous waste is stored in containers and tanks and also treated in tanks, via a filter press, and incineration. To store, treat and incinerate this hazardous waste, BP Chemicals, Inc., needs a permit. To issue this final renewal Permit, Ohio EPA determined that the Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards and that the applicant has a history of compliance with relevant environmental laws, given the potential for harm to the public health and safety and the environment that could result from the irresponsible operation of the facility. The final Hazardous Waste permit contains the conditions under which the facility must operate. It will allow BP Chemicals, Inc., to continue to store hazardous waste in tanks and containers, treat hazardous waste in tanks, via a filter press, and incineration. It will also require the company to investigate and, if necessary, clean up any contamination from hazardous wastes or constituents from the waste management units that may be at the facility.

Can I appeal this permit?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this renewal Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final renewal Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than January 19, 2003. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. You must file your appeal with ERAC at the following address: ***Environmental Review Appeals Commission***, 236 E. Town Street, Room 300, Columbus, Ohio 43215. ANTIDEGRADATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for the modification of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit No. 11N00180 for the discharge from the existing sedimentation pond from the Rumpke Sanitary Landfill and for the proposed discharge from a new sedimentation pond proposed in the Southern Expansion. The proposed sedimentation pond is designed to treat 12.9 million gallons for storm water runoff associated with landfill activities. The Rumpke Sanitary Landfill is located at 10795 Hughes Road, Colerain Township, Hamilton County, Ohio. Treated storm waters are proposed to be discharged at the same location. The proposed discharges is to Banklick Creek and subsequently the Great Miami River. Other wastewater disposal alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality will be considered by Ohio EPA.

The discharges from this facility, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Banklick Creek and possibly the Great Miami River. However, the chemical-specific water quality criteria developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in OAC 3745-1, will not be exceeded. In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.

The contents of the above stated application indicate an exclusion from various portions of the antidegradation review and information submittal requirements applies as outlined by section 3745-1-05 (D)(1) of the antidegradation rule (effective as of October 1, 1996). The exclusion relates to a de minimis net increase in the discharge of a regulated pollutant.
