**OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL RENEWAL HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT TO
GABRIEL PERFORMANCE PRODUCTS, ASHTABULA, OHIO**

On September 30, 2003, Ohio EPA issued a final renewal Ohio Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) to Gabriel Performance Products, LLC for its facility at 725 State Road, Ashtabula, Ohio 44004. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD003913308.

Why does Gabriel Performance Products, LLC need a Permit?

Gabriel Performance Products (Gabriel) is engaged in process development and production of speciality chemicals. From these activities hazardous wastes are generated, stored in accumulation areas and sent off-site within 90 days of generation. Closure of the storage areas has now been certified by the facility and approved by Ohio EPA. Gabriel Performance Products is now involved in corrective action activities and must renew their permit for this purpose. To issue this final renewal Permit, Ohio EPA determined that the Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards and that the applicant has a history of compliance with relevant environmental laws, given the potential for harm to the public health and safety and the environment that could result from the irresponsible operation of the facility. The renewal Permit allows the company to continue to perform corrective action activities at the designated areas and will require Gabriel to investigate and, if necessary, clean up any contamination from hazardous wastes or constituents that may be at the facility. Can I appeal this permit?

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for a project to construct a synagogue complex which will consist of a school building, chapel, recreation area, parking area, and retention basin. The project would impact 2.74 acres of federally jurisdictional wetlands and 389 linear feet of intermittent streams. **OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL RENEWAL OHIO HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT TO
ROSS INCINERATION SERVICES, GRAFTON, OHIO**

On September 30, 2003, Ohio EPA issued a final Ohio Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit Renewal (Permit) to Ross Incineration Services, Inc. for its facility at 36790 Giles Road, Grafton, Ohio 44044. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD048415665.

Why does Ross Incineration Services, Inc. (Ross) need a Permit?

Ross is a commercial incineration facility that treats hazardous waste received from off-site. The facility also stores hazardous waste in containers and tanks; treats waste in tanks, a filter press and in an incinerator. Typical hazardous waste types received at the facility include: halogenated and non-halogenated spent solvents, paints, off-specification commercial chemical products and still residues. Wastes generated at the facility consist primarily of treatment residuals from the incineration process, which are sent off-site for disposal. To store and treat hazardous wastes, Ross needs a Hazardous Waste Permit. The final renewal Permit contains the conditions under which the facility must operate. To issue this final renewal Permit, Ohio EPA determined that the Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards and that the applicant has a history of compliance with relevant environmental laws, given the potential for harm to the public health and safety and the environment that could result from the irresponsible operation of the facility. The renewal Permit allows Ross to continue to store hazardous waste in containers and tanks, and treat hazardous waste in tanks and by incineration. It will also require Ross to investigate and, if necessary, clean up any contamination from hazardous wastes or constituents that may be at the facility. Some RCRA regulations have not been authorized in the state of Ohio, therefore US EPA must issue a permit to cover those regulations. Ross Incineration's complete RCRA permit is comprised of both the US EPA and Ohio EPA permits.
