Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and Public Hearing**

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of Ohio Revised Code Section 6111.51, proposes new rules 3745-4-01, 3745-4-02, 3745-4-03, 3745-4-04, 3745-4-05 and 3745-4-06 of the Administrative Code.

The rules will implement the requirement of Ohio Revised Code section 6111.51 to establish criteria for three levels of credible data related to surface water monitoring and assessment. The rules establish the necessary training and experience needed to submit credible data and requirements for sample collection, analytical methods, data assessment and quality assurance/quality control procedures for each of the three levels of credible data. The rules also: define training and experience requirements for qualified data collectors; describe sampling protocols and field methods to ensure that the data collection and interpretation are reproducible, scientifically defensible and free from pre-conceived bias; require each state agency in possession of surface water quality data to submit the data to Ohio EPA; and require Ohio EPA to establish and maintain a computerized database of all credible water quality data submitted to the Agency.

A public hearing on the proposed rules will be held on Wednesday, August 3, 2005 in conference room 1918 of the Vern Riffe Center for Government and the Arts, located at 77 South High Street in Columbus, Ohio. The public hearing will begin at 2:00 p.m. and adjourn when commenters complete their statements. All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented at the hearing and give written or oral comments on the proposed rules. Written comments may be filed with the presiding officer at the hearing or with Ohio EPA (Attention: Gail Hesse, Ohio EPA, Division of Surface Water, P.O. Box 1049, 122 South Front Street, Columbus, Ohio 43216-1049) by the close of business on August 15, 2005. Comments received after this date will not be considered to be part of the official record of the hearing.

GOVERNING HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT**

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) section 3734.12, has adopted the following amended rule of the Ohio Administrative Code, as ordered on June 29, 2005:

3745-50-54 Duration of permits.

The primary purpose of this rule-making is to make this rule consistent with the change to ORC section 3734.02(E)(2) that appeared in House Bill 432. That legislation changed the maximum length of a hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit from five years to ten years. The same amendment was made to this rule of the Ohio Administrative Code; no other changes were made to this rule.

The Director of Environmental Protection, after considering public comment on the proposed hazardous waste management rule, adopted this rule in final form pursuant to ORC section 3734.12. The amended rule will become effective on July 11, 2005 in accordance with ORC section 119.04(A).

This rule is available electronically from the Register of Ohio, and will remain available there for approximately thirty days after its effective date. It may also be accessed at the Division of Hazardous Waste Management web site at www.epa.state.oh.us/dhwm/welcome at the "Rules and Laws" icon.

**PUBLIC NOTICE
OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR SECTION 401 CERTIFICATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) is reviewing an application, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for a project to redesign a portion of the existing interchange at Interstate 270 and 71. The application was submitted by the Ohio Department of Transportation, 1980 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43223. The project is located within the cities of Columbus and Worthington, Franklin County, Ohio. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 052266. The ODOT ID Number for the project is FRA-270-24.47, PID 77320.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of the Scioto River Watershed. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1-05, 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation, or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by Paragraph 3745-1-05 (D) of the Antidegradation Rule, apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

Starting July 8, 2005, copies of the application for the certification and technical support information may be inspected at Ohio EPA-DSW, P.O. Box 1049, Columbus, Ohio 43216-1049 by first calling (614) 644-2001. Applications can be made available at Ohio EPA District Offices by calling the same number.

Ohio EPA will hold a public information session and public hearing relative to issues of lower water quality at 6:30 PM on August 25, 2005 at the Worthington Municipal Building, 2nd Floor Meeting Room, 6550 North High Street, Worthington, Ohio 43085. The public hearing will end when all interested parties have had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the projects.

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and give written or oral comments on the proposed projects. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain additional information that will be considered by the director of Ohio EPA prior to any further action on the application. Written

comments must be received by the Ohio EPA-DSW, Attention: Permits Processing Unit, P.O. Box 1049, Columbus, Ohio, 43216-1049 by the close of business on September 1, 2005. Comments received after this date may not be considered as part of the official record of the hearing.
