NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION AND PUBLIC HEARING**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, an after the fact Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for a project to construct 100 linear feet of erosion protection / slope stabilization along the shoreline of Lake Erie. The application was submitted by Keith Muny, 19950 Frazier Drive, Rocky River, Ohio 44116. The project is located at 19950 Frazier Drive, Rocky River, Cuyahoga County, Ohio. The Buffalo District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Public Notice Number for this application is 2004-02262(0). The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 052396.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would have minimal biological and physical impact since the existing lake bottom at the site is of poor quality for fish spawning due to the rocky nature of the shale bottom and there are no trees or significant coastal habitat or water edge plants on the natural shoreline. The human health impact would benefit the owner in the form of substantial reduction of the danger of children falling from the bluff and sudden slope failure of the shale bluff. The approximate amount of fill placed in Lake Erie is 628 cubic yards.

The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would have minimal biological and physical impact since the existing lake bottom at the site is of poor quality for fish spawning due to the rocky nature of the shale bottom and there are no trees or significant coastal habitat or water edge plants on the natural shoreline. The human health impact would provide a very minimal benefit to the owner because there would still remain the potential of falling from the bluff and the uncertainty of when the bluff will experience the next sudden catastrophic slope failure because the upper reaches of the bluff would still be unsupported. The approximate amount of fill placed in Lake Erie is 400 cubic yards.

The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on streams or wetlands.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Lake Erie. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by Paragraph 3745-1-05 (D) of the Antidegradation Rule (effective as of May 1, 1998), apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

Beginning June 20, 2006, copies of the application for the certification and technical support information may be inspected at Ohio EPA-DSW, P.O. Box 1049, Columbus, Ohio 43216-1049 by first calling (614) 644-2001. Applications can be made available at the Ohio EPA District Offices by calling the same number.

The public hearing will end when all interested parties have had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the projects.

Ohio EPA and PPG Industries Assessing Cleanup in Circleville

Ohio EPA and PPG Industries of Ohio, Inc., are reviewing the effectiveness of the cleanup at PPG's 559 Pittsburgh Road location in Circleville; and the review should be completed by January 2007. A five-year review of remedial actions is required at sites where cleanup activities are ongoing. The review will determine if cleanup activities remain protective of human health and the environment.

The principal operation at the PPG facility is manufacturing of resins used in paint products. Historically, PPG's use of wastewater infiltration ponds prior to 1980 resulted in ethylbenzene, toluene, xylene and 1,4 dioxane impacts to ground water. However, only 1,4 dioxane migrated off site. PPG closed the infiltration ponds in 1980 with impacted soils placed at an area identified as PSA-2 on PPG's property.

The 1,4 dioxane in ground water is being addressed by institutional controls such as deed restrictions; engineering controls including ground water extraction at wells operated by PPG and DuPont; and long-term monitoring, which involves sampling several monitoring wells within and beyond the area impacted by the 1,4 dioxane.

The PSA-2 area also is being addressed by institutional controls such as a deed restriction; engineering controls, which include security and maintenance of cover; and long-term monitoring, which consists of ground water sampling down gradient of PSA-2.

Documents relating to the investigation and cleanup of the site are currently available for review at the Pickaway County Public Library, 1160 North Court Street, Circleville.
