ANTIDEGRADATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for the modification of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the discharge from the existing Hanson Aggregates Midwest, Inc. Plum Run Plant located at 848 Plum Run Road, Meigs Township, Adams County, Ohio. The application was submitted by Hanson Aggregates Midwest, Inc., 848 Plum Run Road, Peebles, Ohio 45660.

Hanson Aggregates Midwest, Inc. is proposing to install a discharge pipe under a road to a roadside ditch. The discharge will travel through three holding ponds prior to discharging to the roadside ditch. The roadside ditch will be rip-rapped from the pipe to discharge into Plum Run to prevent erosion. The discharges are to Plum Run.

Other wastewater disposal alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality will be considered by Ohio EPA.

The discharges from this facility, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Plum Run. However, the chemical-specific water quality criteria developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in OAC 3745-1, will not be exceeded. In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.

ANTIDEGRADATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for the modification of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the discharge from the existing Conesville Generating Station located at 47201 county Road 273, Franklin Township, Coshocton County, Ohio. The application was submitted by American Electric Power, 1 Riverside Plaza, Columbus, Ohio 43215.

American Electric Power is proposing to install flue gas desulfurization and selective catalytic reduction systems at Unit 4 to further reduce air emissions as required under the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990. The project may result in an increase in pollutants from a chloride purge waste stream generated during flue gas desulfurization. The discharges are to the Muskingum River.

Other wastewater disposal alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality will be considered by Ohio EPA.

The discharges from this facility, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of the Muskingum River. However, the chemical-specific water quality criteria developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in OAC 3745-1, will not be exceeded. In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.

PUBLIC NOTICE NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for construction of a 210-acre distribution and service center development project. The application was submitted by the New Albany Company, 8000 Walton Parkway, New Albany, Ohio 43054. The project is located north of State Route 161 and west of Beech Road in the Village of New Albany, Franklin and Licking Counties, Ohio. The Huntington District Corps of Engineers Public Notice Number for the project is 200200751. The Ohio EPA ID Number for the project is 062653.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would impact 2,850 linear feet of intermittent stream and 1.69 acres of six jurisdictional wetlands in conjunction with the construction of three building pads, associated parking and stormwater management facilities at the site. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would impact 2,850 linear feet of intermittent stream and 1.04 acres of four jurisdictional wetlands. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Blacklick Creek. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the OHIO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation, or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outline by 3745-1-05 of the Antidegradation Rule apply or may be granted by the Director of the OHIO EPA.

Total of 880 cubic yards of fill below OHW. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would rehabilitate 85 linear feet of existing armor stone groin and 86 linear feet of existing concrete revetment with new armor stone and construct a new 55 linear foot detached breakwater. Total of 800 cubic yards of fill below OHW. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on streams or wetlands.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Lake Erie. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.
