URBAN SETTING DESIGNATION FOR
Lorain Waterfront Development Area USD, Lorain, Ohio

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has received, on July 14, 2006, a request to approve an Urban Setting Designation for approximately 107.9 acres of land located along the Lake Erie shore surrounding the mouth of the Black River. This request was submitted by Mr. Michael J. Mc Kim, Certified Professional, of URS, on behalf of the City of Lorain. Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code 3745-300-10(D), Ohio's Voluntary Action Program (VAP) allows for the voluntary clean up of contaminated property in Ohio without the risk of state civil liability. Under VAP, ground water cleanup is required where contaminated ground water poses risks to the community or environment.

A USD may be requested for properties participating in the VAP when there is no current or anticipated future use of ground water by local residents for drinking, showering, bathing or cooking. In these areas, an approved USD would lower the cost of cleanup and promote economic redevelopment while still protecting public health and safety.

The Ohio EPA director may approve the request for a USD based on a demonstration by the certified professional that the USD requirements are met and an evaluation of existing or future uses of ground water in the area have been assessed.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for a project to construct a residential subdivision and attendant features on a 56 acre site. The application was submitted by Village Communities, 470 Olde Worthington Road, Westerville, Ohio, 43082. The project is bound by Africa Road to the west and is approximately 800 feet south of State Route 36/37 in Berlin Township, Delaware County, Ohio. The Huntington District Corps of Engineers Public Notice Number for this project is 200500183. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 062596.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would impact 975 feet of ephemeral, 970 feet of intermittent, and 280 feet of perennial streams and fill 0.02 acre of Wetland 2. Sections of the streams will be filled to construct road crossings throughout the site. Mitigation will consist of stream habitat protection and stream channel restoration. The mitigation plan proposes stream enhancement offsite and onsite. The off-site mitigation is located along Alum Creek east of Bale-Kenyon Road NE (S.R. 37), approximately 3,000 feet south of East Orange in Orange Township, Delaware County, Ohio. Alum Creek will be enhanced at this location within a 200 foot buffer (100 feet on each side) along 652.5 linear feet of the east bank and 1209 linear feet along the west bank. Approximately 150 linear feet of an unnamed tributary to Alum Creek will also be enhanced in this location within a 50 foot buffer. Currently the buffers are agricultural. Alum Creek and the tributary will be enhanced by removing the buffers from agricultural use and replacing them with a wet mesic native seed mix and native riparian corridor saplings and placed into a preservation easement. To further compensate for impacts, the same native seed mix and saplings will be placed along 200 linear feet of a severely degraded stream on site. The preservation easements will be maintained by the affiliated home owner's associations.

The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would have 1460 linear feet of stream impacts. The same mitigation plan for offsite stream enhancement would be implemented in this alternative.

The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state.

The discharge from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality in the Alum Creek watershed. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be

conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation, or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by 3745-01-05 of the Antidegradation Rule apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.
