ORC Section 3745.30(A)(1) excludes documents regarding the internal organization or operation of the Agency. The Division has removed some policies because they do not conform to the definition of policy material as contained in ORC 3745.30. Other policies have been removed because they have been replaced by rules or guidance materials. There are no new policy documents.

URBAN SETTING DESIGNATION FOR
UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON CAMPUS WEST PROJECT, DAYTON, OHIO**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has received, on October 2, 2006, a request to approve an Urban Setting Designation for approximately 51.0 acres of land located at 300 College Park in Dayton (Montgomery County). This request was submitted by Hull & Associates, Inc. on behalf of the University of Dayton, Dayton, Ohio, the property owner.

Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code 3745-300-10(D), Ohio's Voluntary Action Program (VAP) allows for the voluntary clean up of contaminated property in Ohio without the risk of state civil liability. Under VAP, ground water cleanup is required where contaminated ground water poses risks to the community or environment.

A USD may be requested for properties participating in the VAP when there is no current or anticipated future use of ground water by local residents for drinking, showering, bathing or cooking. In these areas, an approved USD would lower the cost of cleanup and promote economic redevelopment while still protecting public health and safety. If this USD were to be approved, the ground water cleanup or response requirements for the property would be lessened. The ground water under portions of the University of Dayton Campus West Project contains solvents from former manufacturing businesses.

The Ohio EPA director may approve the request for a USD based on a demonstration by the certified professional that the USD requirements are met and an evaluation of existing or future uses of ground water in the area have been assessed.

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has issued a draft general permit authorization to discharge wastewater from temporary discharges.

Temporary discharges, may be associated with some type of facility or site cleanup, or one-time emergency discharge due to unusual or short-term circumstances, or discharges from a pilot project or test facility. The type of pollutants found in temporary discharges may be quite variable due to the differences in projects. Also, flow rates could be quite different depending on the size of the project. The concentration of the discharges must be *de minimus*, defined as less than ten percent of the waste load allocation for all applicable pollutants. In addition, temporary discharges are defined as facilities or projects that discharge for a time period not to exceed 60 days.

This permit would be a new general permit, and will be subject to the requirements of Ohio's anti-degradation rule (Ohio Administrative Code 3745-1-05). The general permit is proposed for a duration of five years.

Ohio EPA will hold a public information session and public hearing relative to issues of lower water quality at 3:00 p.m. on February 13, 2007 at Ohio EPA's Central Office, Conference Room B, 50 West Town Street, Suite 700, Columbus, Ohio 43215. The public hearing will end when all interested parties have had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the draft permit.

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and give written or oral comments on the draft permit. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain additional

information that will be considered by the Director of Ohio EPA prior to any further action on the draft permit.

In accordance with OAC3745-1-05, Ohio EPA will provide an opportunity for public comment concerning this draft general permit. Comments received shall be considered by the Director before the draft permit is issued as final. Persons wishing to be on the Ohio EPA's interested parties mailing list for this project or wishing to submit comments for Ohio EPA's consideration may do so in writing to Ohio EPA, Division of Surface Water, Attention: Permits Processing Unit, P.O. OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL RENEWAL AND PERMIT MODIFICATIONS TO HUKILL CORPORATION

On December 28, 2006, Ohio EPA issued a final renewal and modifications to the Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) for Hukill Chemical Corporation (Hukill) at 7013 Krick Road, Bedford, Ohio 44146. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD001926740.

Why does Hukill need a Permit Renewal and Modifications?

Hukill is a permitted hazardous waste treatment and storage facility engaged in solvent recycling and fuel blending activities. Hukill wishes to continue to store hazardous waste in containers and tanks, treat hazardous waste in tanks, and continue closure, post-closure and corrective action activities. Hukill also wishes to establish an Integrated Ground Water Monitoring Program and install an additional ground water monitoring well. The final renewal Permit and modifications contain the conditions under which the facility must operate. To issue this final Permit, Ohio EPA determined that the Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards and that the applicant has a history of compliance with relevant environmental laws. The final Permit will require Hukill to investigate and, if necessary, clean up any contamination from hazardous wastes or constituents that may be at the facility. Can I appeal this Permit and Modifications?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than January 27, 2007. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. On December 28, 2006, Ohio EPA issued a final class 3 hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Permit) modification to Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc., Hebron Recycle Center, for its facility at 581 Milliken Drive SE, Hebron, Ohio 43025. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD980587364.

Why does Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc. need a Permit modification?

Safety-Kleen Systems, Inc. (Safety-Kleen) recycles a variety of spent solvents and solvent-contaminated waste waters for beneficial reuse/recovery. Safety-Kleen stores these solvents and waste waters in tanks and containers prior to recycling. Safety-Kleen wishes to 1) increase the container and tank storage capacity by 818,440 gallons, and add 25 waste codes to the list of waste codes the facility is permitted to receive; and, 2) permit Tanks 97 and 98 as treatment tanks for fuel blending spent solvents. The final Permit modification contains the conditions under which the facility must operate. To issue this final Permit modification, Ohio EPA determined that the Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards. Can I appeal this Permit and Modifications?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than January 27, 2007. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
