

Ohio EPA Drycleaning General Permits Amendments for Comment

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection ("Ohio EPA") is making available for public comment the following emissions unit specific terms and conditions for modified model general permits (MGP) under the Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC):

- Terms and Conditions for Dry to Dry perchloroethylene dry cleaning non-residential facility that uses up to 2100 gallons perchloroethylene per rolling, 12-month period and is equipped with a carbon adsorber.

- Terms and Conditions for Dry to Dry perchloroethylene dry cleaning non-residential facility that uses up to 2100 gallons perchloroethylene per rolling, 12-month period, installed before December 21, 2005.

These amendments are necessary to incorporate changes resulting from the April 1, 2008 amendment of the "National Perchloroethylene Air Emissions Standards for Dry Cleaning Facilities contained in 40 CFR Part 63, Subpart M ("Perc Drycleaning MACT").

USEPA amended the Perc Drycleaning MACT that was recently promulgated on July 27, 2006 to correct applicability cross references that were not correctly amended between the most recent proposed and final rule revisions, and to clarify that condenser performance monitoring may be done by either of two prescribed methods (pressure or temperature), regardless of whether an installed pressure gauge is present. Without these amendments, new area sources could erroneously be required to perform monitoring that was proposed for only major sources, and installed condenser performance gauge readings could be required of sources when a prescribed temperature method is just as valid for compliance purposes. Ohio EPA has incorporated these change into our General Permit documents.

The Ohio EPA, DAPC general permit program is regulated under Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 3745-31-29, "General Permit to Install," and 3745-35-08, "General Permit to Operate." This notice is being issued in order to fulfill the requirements of OAC Rule 3745-31-29(A)(3) and OAC Rule 3745-35-08(A)(3). Notice is hereby given that on May 7, 2008, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA"), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") Chapter 3746 and Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Chapter 3745-300, issued a Covenant Not To Sue/Final Findings and Orders to the City of Toledo for the property identified as the Marina District property (the "Property").

The City of Toledo conducted a voluntary action of the approximately 31.8127-acre Property located at 1401 Front Street, Toledo, Lucas County, Ohio. The issuance of the Covenant Not to Sue/Final Findings and Orders is a final action of the Director. The action may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission ("Commission") pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days after the appeal is filed with the Commission. The application was submitted by Division of Parks and Recreation, Ohio Department of Natural Resources, 2045 Morse Road, Building C-3, Columbus, Ohio 43229. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would be the same as the proposed preferred alternative except this plan would be using 96Æ of steel seawall instead of clean soil fill and stone. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on the waters of the state.

The discharge from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of the Maumee River. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapter 3245-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).
