OHIO EPA ISSUES DRAFT MODIFIED HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT

On May 20, 2008, Ohio EPA issued a draft modified hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Hazardous Waste Permit) to The Lubrizol Corporation (Lubrizol), for its facility at 29400 Lakeland Boulevard, Wickliffe, Ohio 44092. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD004172565.

Why does Lubrizol need this Permit modification?

Lubrizol is engaged in container storage and tank storage and treatment of hazardous waste. To store and treat this hazardous waste, Lubrizol needs a Hazardous Waste Permit. The Director of Ohio EPA is initiating this modification to authorize Lubrizol to perform specific corrective action measures as part of its site-wide corrective action. Ohio EPA has reviewed the facility's investigation information collected to date and recommends that an Environmental Covenant be placed on the property. Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for the construction of a shore-connected armor stone breakwater and steel-framed access tower with an elevated concrete platform. The application was submitted by the City of Avon Lake, c/o Mr. Joseph Reitz, Engineering Manager, 150 Avon Belden Road, Avon Lake, Ohio 441012. The project is located along the Lake Erie shoreline at City of Avon Lake public park property, approximately 300 feet east of the intersection of Route 83 (Avon Belden Road) and State Route 6 (Lake Road). The Buffalo District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has authorized the Minimal Degradation Alternative for this project via Nationwide Permit #13, subject to activity specific Section 401 Water Quality Certification by the Ohio EPA. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 083326.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed Preferred Alternative, if approved, would result in a total of 163 cy of armor layer stone and 213 cy of concrete rubble and/or stone underlayer and core materials to be placed below the plane of ordinary high water (OHW = 573.4 feet IGLD 1985) and above existing grade for a total of 376 cubic yards of fill. The applicant's proposed Minimal Degradation Alternative, if approved, would result in a total of 140 cy of armor layer stone and 128 cy of concrete rubble and/or stone underlayer and core materials to be placed below the plane of ordinary high water (OHW = 573.4 feet IGLD 1985) and above existing grade for a total of 268 cubic yards of fill. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on streams or wetlands.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Lake Erie. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by Paragraph 3745-1-05 (D) of the Antidegradation Rule (effective as of May 1, 1998), apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA. This facility operates a printing operation that prints on metal and is a large quantity generator of hazardous waste. Tecnocap also accumulates hazardous waste less than 50 feet from the property line. The EPA I.D. number for this facility is OHD981582524.

Tecnocap LLC is exempt from the requirement to store ignitable hazardous waste at least 50 feet from the Facility property line , as required by OAC rule 3745-66-76. This final action was not preceded by a proposed action and is appealable to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission.
