Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of Ohio Revised Code Section 3704.03 has:

1. Adopted amendments to the following OAC rules: 3745-31-02, Requirements; 3745-31-03, Permit to install exemptions; 3745-31-04, Applications; 3745-31-05, Criteria for decision by the director; 3745-31-07, Revocation; 3745-31-10, Air stationary source obligations; 3745-31-20, Attainment provisions - innovative control technology; 3745-31-22, Nonattainment provisions - conditions for approval; 3745-31-29, General permit to install; 3745-31-30, Clean unit; 3745-31-31, Pollution control project; 3745-31-32, Plantwide applicability limit; and 3745-31-33, Site preparation activities prior to obtaining a final permit to install.

2. Rescinded the following existing OAC rules and adopted new OAC rules in their place: 3745-31-06, Termination (rescind); 3745-31-06, Completeness determinations, processing requirements, public participation, public notice and issuance (new); 3745-31-08, Procedure for decision by director (rescind); 3745-31-08, Registration status permit-to-operate (new); 3745-31-09, Air permit to install completeness determinations, public participation and public notice (rescind); and 3745-31-09, Variance on operation (new).

1. Adopted amendments to OAC rule 3745-15-03, Submission of emission information, which satisfies the requirements of Section 119.032 of the Ohio Revised Code (five-year review).

2. Rescinded the following OAC rules: 3745-35-01, Definitions; 3745-35-02, Permits to operate; 3745-35-03, Variances; 3745-35-04, General policy; 3745-35-05, Permit exemptions and registration status; 3745-35-06, Permits to operate for grain and feed processing operations and fertilizer mixing operations; 3745-35-07, Federally enforceable limitations on potential to emit; and 3745-35-08, General permit to operate.

The amendments were proposed to implement the permit-to-install and operate (PTIO) program. The PTIO program combines the current permit-to-install (PTI) and permit-to-operate (PTO) programs. Rather than requiring a source to apply for a PTI, which is issued with both installation and operation terms, and then apply for a PTO within a year of construction, the new program requires one application for both a PTI and PTO and both installation and operation requirements will be issued under one document.

Pursuant to Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code, DAPC is required to consult with interested parties affected by the rules before the division formally adopts them. On March 14, 2007 these rules went out for a 30 day review by interested parties. Pursuant to Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, a public hearing on these rule changes was conducted on August 10, 2007 in Columbus, Ohio. The Director's order of adoption was issued on June 2, 2008. The effective date of these rules is June 30, 2008.

The project is located at the northeast corner of the Worthington Road and Polaris Parkway Intersection, in the City of Westerville, Delaware County, Ohio. If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than July 3, 2008. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. **OHIO EPA ISSUES DRAFT STATEMENT OF BASIS FOR PREFERRED
WASTE REMEDIATION**

On June 5, 2008, Ohio EPA issued a Statement of Basis to Thomas Steel Strip Corporation for its property located at Delaware Avenue NW, Warren, Ohio 44485-2699. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD077755213.

Why does Thomas Steel Strip Corporation need a Statement of Basis?

Thomas Steel Strip Corporation is addressing the soil contamination at the former hazardous waste surface impoundments that are subject to correction action. The Statement of Basis (SB) identifies Ohio EPA's preferred remedies, explains the reasons for the selection of the remedies, solicits public review and comments and provides information on how the public can be involved in the remedy selection process. The SB allows Thomas Steel Strip to institute corrective action activities at the designated areas when a final decision is issued.

How can I tell Ohio EPA what I think about this Statement of Basis?

You can submit written comments anytime between **June 6, 2008** and **July 21, 2008**.
