**ASHTABULA HARBOR**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 Certification for a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) dredging project located in Ashtabula Harbor. The application was submitted by the USACE, Buffalo District, 1776 Niagara Street, Buffalo, NY 14207. The project is located within the limits of the Federal navigation channels in the harbor's entrance, and middle to East Outer Harbor channels. The USACE, Buffalo District Public Notice number for this project is 09-6. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 093477.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, will be to dredge an estimated 300,000 cubic yards of material in 2009, with the placement of the dredged material at the existing open-lake area in Lake Erie. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, will be to dredge an estimated 150,000 cubic yards of dredged material from the Federal navigation channels in 2009, with the disposal of the dredged material at the existing open-lake area in Lake Erie. Dredging shall not occur during Lake Erie storm events. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality at the existing 640-acre dredged material open-lake placement area in Lake Erie, located approximately 2.25 miles from the end of the harbor's East Breakwater, at an azimuth of 11°15'. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by 3745-1-05 of the Antidegradation Rule apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

**OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL MODIFIED HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT**

On February 13, 2009, Ohio EPA issued a final Class 3 modified hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Hazardous Waste Permit) to BP-Husky Refining LLC (formerly BP Products North America) for its facility at 4001 Cedar Point Road, Oregon, Ohio 43616. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD005057542.

**Why does BP-Husky Refining LLC need this permit modification?**

The facility is a manufacturer of petroleum products and is required to have an Ohio Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit for the purpose of accomplishing closure, post closure and corrective action activities at several inactive units. Under this final action, the facility changed its owner's name from BP Products North America, Toledo Refinery to BP-Husky Refining LLC. To issue this final Permit modification, Ohio EPA determined that the Hazardous Waste Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards.

**Can I appeal this final modified Permit?**

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this modified Permit, you have the right to appeal this Permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, rule 3745-1-05 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would impact 0.329 acres of Category 3 emergent/shrub/forested wetland. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would impact 0.27 acres of Category 3 emergent/shrub/forested wetland. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state. Proposed mitigation for the impact involves on-site mitigation which includes removal of trash in the wetland, invasive species management and placement of signs to restrict access. In addition, the wetland resource will be protected in perpetuity by an environmental covenant.

Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of a Category 3 wetland adjacent to Moxahala Creek. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality.
