PUBLIC NOTICE

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of standards and regulations. The Director of the Ohio EPA is public noticing a draft permit that regulates storm water discharges from the City of Toledo municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) to surface waters of the State on May 13, 2009. The draft permit will be issued as a final action unless the Director revises it after consideration of comments made in writing or at a public meeting, or upon disapproval by the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Any person may submit written comments on the draft permit for the administrative record. A public meeting may be held to explain the content of the permit and its applicability. The date, time and location of the public meeting will be public noticed if one is to be held.

The permit affords coverage to all areas within the corporate boundary of the City of Toledo served by its MS4 and authorizes existing or new storm water point source discharges to surface waters of the State from the MS4. The permit contains requirements for a storm water management program to reduce pollutant discharges from the MS4. The permit also contains monitoring requirements to identify the impact of the discharges from the MS4 on water bodies and to assess the effectiveness of the storm water management program.

Interested person are invited to submit written comments on the permit. Comments should be submitted no later than 30 days after the date of this public notice. Deliver or mail all comments to:

Notice is hereby given that on May 6, 2009, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (“Ohio EPA”), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (“ORC”) Chapter 3746 and Ohio Administrative Code (“OAC”) Chapter 3745-300, issued a Covenant Not To Sue/Final Findings and Orders to Bud Industries, Inc. for the property identified as the Bud Industries, Inc. property (the “Property”).

OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL MODIFIED HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT

On May 6, 2009, Ohio EPA issued a final modified hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Hazardous Waste Permit) to Chemical Solvents, Inc., for its facility at 1010 Denison Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44109. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD980897656.

Why does Chemical Solvents, Inc., need this Permit modification?

Chemical Solvents, Inc. (Chemical Solvents) is engaged primarily in the recycling of dirty or spent halogenated and non-halogenated solvents. The Director of Ohio EPA initiated this modification to require Chemical Solvents, Inc., to implement specific corrective measures to satisfy its corrective action obligations. Ohio EPA reviewed the facility's investigation information collected to date and is requiring an environmental covenant to be placed on the Fuel Storage Tank Area Waste Management Units 12 and 13, and the Non-hazardous Waste Holding Area. To issue this final modified permit, Ohio EPA determined that the selected corrective measures meet appropriate standards.

Can I appeal this modified permit?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than June 8, 2009. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. **OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL FINDINGS AND ORDERS TO
U.S. EPA TEST AND EVALUATION**

On May 1, 2009, Ohio EPA issued final Findings and Orders to the U.S. EPA Test and Evaluation facility located at 1600 Gest Street, Cincinnati, Ohio 45268. This facility typically stores and treats hazardous waste that is excluded from the hazardous waste permitting requirements pursuant to ORC 3747.02(G) and OAC 3745-51-04. The EPA I.D. number for this facility is OH3680090005.

U.S EPA Test & Evaluation facility is exempt from the requirement to have a hazardous waste permit for its storage and/or treatment of hazardous waste in volumes or quantities exceeding the capacity limitations of Ohio's treatability studies exclusion rule. This final action was not preceded by a proposed action and is appealable to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission.
