The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION AND PUBLIC HEARING
ANTIDegradation**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for the modification of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit (3PK00032) for the discharge from the existing Lake County Madison Wastewater Treatment Plant. Public notice is also given that Ohio EPA-DSW has received an application for Permit to Install (PTI) (710425) for the construction of the proposed wastewater treatment plant improvements and expansion. The NPDES and PTI applications were submitted by the Lake County Department of Utilities, 105 Main Street, Painesville, Ohio 44077.

The NPDES modification and PTI applications submitted for approval propose to treat 5,000,000 gallons per day of sanitary wastewater. The Lake County Madison Wastewater Treatment Plant is located at 7815 Cashen Road, Madison Township, Lake County, Ohio. Other wastewater disposal alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality will be considered by Ohio EPA.

The discharges from the wastewater treatment plant, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Lake Erie. However, the chemical-specific water quality criteria developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in OAC 3745-1, will not be exceeded. In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.

An Ohio EPA public hearing on the proposed project has been scheduled for 6:30 P.M. on July 16, 2009, at the Madison Township Administration Building, 2065 Hubbard Road, Madison, Ohio 44057. The public hearing will end when everyone in attendance has had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the project.

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and give written or oral comments on the project. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain additional information that will be considered by the director of Ohio EPA prior to any further action on the applications. **OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL FINDINGS AND ORDERS TO
SUPERIOR MARINE WAYS, INC.**

On May 18, 2009, Ohio EPA issued final Findings and Orders to Superior Marine Ways, Inc. for its facility located at 95 Private Drive, Procterville, Ohio 45669. . This facility is a small quantity generator of hazardous waste and treated such waste by burning it without a permit. . The EPA I.D. number for this facility is OH0000361840.

Superior Marine Ways, Inc. must achieve compliance with Chapter 3734 of the Ohio Revised Code and all corresponding regulations according to the detailed compliance schedule which outlines civil penalties and payments. This final action was not preceded by a proposed action and is appealable to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission.

OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL MODIFIED HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT

On May 20, 2009, Ohio EPA issued a final Class 2 modification to the Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) for Ross Incineration Services, Inc. for its facility located at 36790 Giles Road, Grafton, Ohio 44044. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD048415665.

Why is Ross Incineration Services, Inc. modifying its Permit?

Ross Incineration Services, Inc. (Ross) is permitted to operate a hazardous waste incinerator and other related hazardous waste management units at its facility. Ross is requesting to modify its procedures for recertification of waste profiles at its facility. This final permit modification will allow Ross to make the requested change. To issue this final Permit modification, Ohio EPA determined that the modification application is complete and meets appropriate standards.

Can I appeal this final Permit modification?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this modified Permit, you have the right to appeal the Permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final Permit modification, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than June 22, 2009. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. **Ohio EPA Issues Preferred Plan for
King Road Landfill
Sylvania, Ohio
Extension of Public Comment Period**

On April 16, 2009, Ohio EPA issued a Preferred Plan concerning the former King Road Landfill located at 3535 King Road in Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio. The Preferred Plan provides information regarding Site history, summarizes the investigation of Site contamination, provides an analysis of the feasibility of remedial alternatives, and outlines Ohio EPA's preferred alternative for remediation.

The 104 acre King Road Landfill began waste disposal operations in 1954 and ceased them in 1976. From 1980 through 1991, a transfer station was operated near the main gate on King Road. Based on the information identified during the remedial investigation and feasibility study, the preferred remedial alternative for the Site includes: a landfill cap to ensure slope stability, run-off and vegetative cover, the maintenance of access controls, removal of ditch sediment hot spots, the establishment of a "no well zone" by the Lucas County Board of Health, monitored natural attenuation (i.e., ground water monitoring and evaluation program); and continued operation of the existing leachate collection and pump station at Silica Road as well as the methane gas monitoring and collection trench.

Ohio EPA held a public meeting on May 20, 2009, to answer questions and to accept comments on the Preferred Plan. During the meeting, a request for a 30 day extension to the Public Comment Period was made. Ohio EPA is therefore extending the comment period until June 29, 2009.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF ISOLATED WETLAND PERMIT
APPLICATION (LEVEL 2)**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, an Isolated Wetland Permit (Level 2) for a project to construct a mixed use development impacting 1.89 acres of wetland. The application was submitted by the Chippewa Partners, LLC, 5082 Brompton Drive, Medina, OH 43256. The project is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Lake Road and Long Lane in Medina County near Chippewa Lake. The Ohio EPA Number for this project is 093504.

The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Sections 6111.02 to 6111.028 and other applicable provisions of state laws. Other alternatives as proposed by the applicant resulting in less adverse impact to the isolated wetland ecosystem, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.
