**RECISSION OF FEASIBILITY STUDY**  
**Paddys Run Road Site, near Fernald, Hamilton County, Ohio**

Notice is hereby given that on October 5, 2009, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA"), issued a letter rescinding the Revised Final Feasibility Study for the Paddys Run Road Site ("Site") which was issued by Ohio EPA on October 29, 2004. The Site is approximately 14.3 acres of land located on the east side of Paddys Run Road near the town of Fernald in Hamilton County, Ohio.

Ohio EPA became involved with this Site when the Agency entered into Director's Final Findings and Orders with Albright and Wilson Americas Inc., Mobil Mining and Minerals Co., and Ruetgers-Nease Chemical Company on May 18, 1989 with the purpose of the Respondents conducting a Remedial Investigation (RI) and Feasibility Study (FS). The Respondents have completed the RI. Since 2004 the Respondents have been conducting interim actions to address contamination at the Site, and it has been decided to rescind the FS issued in 2004 because conditions at the Site have changed. The current Respondents for the Site are Exxon Mobil Corporation, Rütgers Organics Corporation and Rhodia, Inc.

The issuance of the letter rescinding the Revised Final FS is a final action of the Director. FLATS USD CLEVELAND**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) has received, on August 3, 2009, a request to approve an Urban Setting Designation (USD) for approximately 21.8581 acres of land located generally bound by railroad lines to the north of Front Avenue, the Cuyahoga River to the west and south, Main Avenue to the east and West 9<sup>th</sup> Street to the northeast. This request was submitted by Mike McKim, with URS, on behalf of the Flats East Development LLC.

Pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code 3745-300-10(C), Ohio's Voluntary Action Program (VAP) allows for the voluntary cleanup of contaminated property in Ohio without the risk of state civil liability. Under the VAP, ground water cleanup is required where contaminated ground water poses risks to the community or environment.

A USD may be requested for properties participating in the VAP when there is no current or anticipated future use of ground water by local residents for drinking, showering, bathing, or cooking. In these areas, an approved USD would lower the cost of cleanup and promote economic redevelopment while still protecting public health and safety.

Ohio EPA's director may approve the request for a USD based on a demonstration by the certified professional that the USD requirements are met and an evaluation of existing or future uses of ground water in the area have been assessed.

Comments regarding this request for the USD must be received by the close of business no later than 30 days from date of publication of this notice. **OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT MODIFICATION**

On October 21, 2009, Ohio EPA issued a final modification to the Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) for Ross Incineration Services, Inc. for its facility located at 36790 Giles Road, Grafton, Ohio 44044. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD048415665.

**Why does Ross Incineration Services, Inc. need this Permit modification?**

Ross Incineration Services, Inc. (RIS) is permitted to operate a hazardous waste incinerator and other related hazardous waste management units at its facility. The Director of Ohio EPA is initiating this final modification to incorporate the Ross Transportation Services, Inc. (RTS) 10-day transfer storage activities into RIS's permit as a hazardous waste container storage unit. Hazardous waste transporters are regulated under OAC Chapter 3475-53 (Transporter Standards). Under the rules of this chapter, a transporter is not required to obtain a hazardous waste permit. However, these standards are no longer applicable once the waste is no longer in the "normal course of transportation." Waste destined for RIS ceases transportation when it arrives at RTS since both entities are located on contiguous property. Therefore, RTS and its hazardous waste management activities are subject to the hazardous waste permitting requirements. This final Permit modification contains the conditions under which the facility must operate.

**Can I appeal this modified permit?**

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

**If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?**

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than November 23, 2009. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Former Dana Glacier Vandervell facility located in

On October 22, 2009, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) issued as a final action Director's Final Findings and Orders (DFFOs) to Gould Electronics, Inc., of Eastlake, Ohio, and Mahle Engine Components USA, Inc., of Caldwell, Ohio, for certain Remedial Design and Remedial Action activities at a portion of the former Dana Glacier Vandervell facility located at 17226 County Road 57 in Olive Township, just south of the Village of Caldwell, Noble County, Ohio (Site).

The DFFOs require implementation of the Amended Decision Document issued on December 28, 2006, including the following actions: excavation and on-site consolidation of contaminated soils and sediments beneath an impervious cap; monitoring of off-site sediments; activity and use limitations, and engineering controls, to address soils beneath the building and loading dock area, which will serve as temporary engineering controls to prevent infiltration of precipitation and leaching of contaminants to groundwater; reduction of groundwater contamination in primary source areas through expanded groundwater recovery and treatment; activity and use limitations to prevent the potable use of site groundwater; and, implementation of an expanded groundwater monitoring plan to assess natural attenuation processes and to provide sufficient monitoring to ensure the protection of potential off-site receptors. The DFFOs also require reimbursement of Ohio EPA's past and future response costs incurred in connection with the Site.

On October 2, 2009, Ohio EPA received a new hazardous waste closure plan from the former Basic, Inc. property for its container and tank storage units located at 495 Emma Street, Bettsville, Ohio 44830. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD004181954.

**Why is Basic, Inc. submitting this Closure Plan?**

As the result of the Final Findings and Orders issued by Ohio EPA, Basic Incorporated submitted this new closure plan. During decommissioning activities of the Pilot Plant, wastewater generated was collected and temporarily stored within a portable roll-off bin style fractionation tank before being taken off-site for wastewater disposal. Both the concrete pad (former location where the facility once stood) and fractionation tank are the subject of this Closure Plan.
