OAC Chapter 3745-1 addresses water quality standards for surface waters of the state. OAC Chapter 3745-2 addresses procedures for implementing water quality standards in wastewater discharge permit limits. OAC Chapter 3745-33 contains the administrative and technical requirements for wastewater discharge permits.

A majority of the proposed amendments are housekeeping in nature. Significant amendments include revision to mixing zone requirements, clarification on facilities required to obtain wastewater discharge permits, revision to imposition of standards of performance for wastewater facilities, revision to the fish tissue mercury value that may be used as an alternative to determine compliance with the mercury water quality standard, clarification on use of 7-day average and daily limitations in discharge permits, clarification on establishment of permit limitations based on design criteria, revision to compliance schedule language to allow a “break in” period, and revision to minimum monitoring requirements for whole effluent toxicity testing.

The public comment period will run until **5:00 p.m. on January 6, 2011**. A public hearing on these proposed rules will be held to consider public comments in accordance with Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code. This hearing will be held **at the Ohio EPA Conference Center, Room B, 50 West Town Street, Suite 700, Columbus, Ohio at 2:00 p.m. on January 6, 2011**. These rules address Research, Development, and Demonstration (RD&D) regulations.

The purpose of this rule making is to create rules to permit research, development, and demonstration (RD&D) projects to stabilize waste through bulk liquid addition, frequently referred to as bioreactor landfills.

**Ohio Environmental Protection Agency**  
**Five-Year Rule Review of Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-18**

Notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC) is proposing new, amended, rescinded and no-change rules in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-18, "Sulfur Dioxide Regulations" to the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review (JCARR) to satisfy the requirements of Section 119.032 of the Ohio Revised Code (five-year review). Specific changes to the rules include:

1. Ohio EPA is removing emission limits from the rules throughout this chapter for air pollution sources that are located at facilities that have been completely and permanently shut down for greater than five years (prior to December 31, 2005). The removal of these sources is being made after discussion with USEPA and is intended to reduce confusion due to the inclusion of emission limits for sources that no longer exist and could not be restarted without completing new source review. These sources will also be removed, where appropriate, from the compliance requirements (OAC rule 3745-18-03) and the measurement methods and requirements (OAC rule 3745-18-04).
2. Ohio EPA will be updating the administrative portions of various rules in this chapter for clarity. Ohio EPA will be replacing the current authorizing statute in these rules, "3704.03", with the more appropriate "3704.03(E)" and the current amplifying statute "3704.02", with the more appropriate "3704.03(A), 3704.03(E)."
3. Ohio EPA is making various minor changes to correct typos and update the rule language in this chapter to meet legislative service commission (LSC) style and formatting guidelines. These changes are being made throughout the chapter, are minor in nature, and do not affect the scope or intent of the rules. Our review also indicates that the following rules continue to be necessary and will be proposed without need for change: OAC rules 3745-18-53, 3745-18-78, 3745-18-80, and 3745-18-90.

Pursuant to Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code, DAPC was required to consult with interested parties affected by the rules before the Division formally adopts them. On June 25, 2010, these rules went out for a 30-day review by interested parties. Comments were received and you can view DAPC's responses to those comments at the website listed below.

Pursuant to Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, a public hearing on these rule changes will be conducted on January 7, 2011, at 10:30 AM, in room 6B at Ohio EPA, Lazarus Government Center, 50 W. Town Street, Suite 700, Columbus, Ohio. All

visitors to Ohio EPA must register at the Security desk in the lobby upon arrival. Please bring photo identification (such as a valid driver's license). For security reasons, visitor's are required to wear their badge at all times while in the building. Please arrive early to complete these procedures.

Pursuant to Part D of Title I of the Clean Air Act, Ohio EPA is required to establish a state implementation plan (SIP) for the attainment and maintenance of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). The above-mentioned rules are a part of Ohio=s SIP and the proposed amendments will be submitted to USEPA as a modification of the SIP. The above-mentioned hearing shall be considered the public hearing for the SIP submittal.

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented at the hearing and give written or oral comments on these rule changes. All oral comments presented at the hearing, and all written statements submitted at the hearing or by the close of business on January 7, 2011, will be considered by Ohio EPA prior to final action on this rule. Written statements submitted after January 7, 2011, may be considered as time and circumstances permit, but will not be part of the official record of the hearing.

Ohio EPA Issues Updated Preferred Plan  
for King Road Landfill  
Sylvania, Ohio;  
Public Meeting to be held**

On November 29, 2010, Ohio EPA issued a Preferred Plan concerning the former King Road Landfill located at 3535 King Road in Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio (Site). The Preferred Plan provides information regarding Site history, summarizes the investigation of Site contamination, provides an analysis of the feasibility of remedial alternatives, and outlines Ohio EPA=s preferred alternative for remediation.

The 104 acre King Road Landfill began waste disposal operations in 1954 and ceased them in 1976. From 1980 through 1991, a transfer station was operated near the main gate on King Road. Based on the information identified during the remedial investigation and feasibility study, the preferred remedial alternative for the Site includes: a landfill cap to ensure slope stability, run-off and vegetative cover, the maintenance of access controls, removal of ditch sediment hot spots, the establishment of a “no well zone” by the Lucas County Board of Health, monitored natural attenuation (i.e., ground water monitoring and evaluation program); and continued operation of the existing leachate collection and pump station at Silica Road as well as the methane gas monitoring and collection trench.

Ohio EPA previously issued a Preferred Plan for this Site on April 16, 2009. A public meeting was held on May 20, 2009, and public comments were accepted, after an approved extension, through June 29, 2009. Also on April 16, 2009, the Director of Ohio EPA issued Final Findings and Orders (Orders), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3734.02(G), exempting the Lucas County Commissioners from the requirement to construct a Composite Cap System in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-11(G), as was described in the April 16, 2009 Preferred Plan. Based on the comments received on the April 16, 2009 Preferred Plan, and on the issuance of the April 16, 2009 Orders, Ohio EPA issued the updated Preferred Plan for the Site on November 29, 2010.

Ohio EPA will hold a public meeting on January 10, 2011, to answer questions and to accept comments on the November 29, 2010 Preferred Plan. The public meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. at the Toledo-Lucas County Public Library (Holland Branch, Room A), located at 1032 South McCord Road, Holland, Ohio (43528). The public meeting will begin with an information session during which Ohio EPA will present a summary of the November 29, 2010 Preferred Plan. After the information session the public can submit oral or written comments for the record regarding the Preferred Plan. Representatives from Ohio EPA will be available following the public hearing portion of the program to answer general questions about the Site and Plan.

In addition to comments provided during the public hearing, Ohio EPA will accept written comments through January 17, 2011.
