OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL RENEWAL HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT**

On June 27, 2011, Ohio EPA issued a final renewal hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Permit) to Wright Patterson Air Force Base (Wright Patterson), for its facility located at 13<sup>th</sup> Street, WPAFB, Ohio 45433. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OH7571724312.

**Why does Wright Patterson need a Permit?**

Wright Patterson is engaged in the storage of industrial waste, solvents, metal plating waste and chemical waste generated by aircraft maintenance. This final renewal Permit is required so Wright Patterson can continue to store waste in containers on-site. The final renewal Permit contains the conditions under which the facility must operate. To issue this final renewal Permit, Ohio EPA determined that the Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards and that the applicant has a history of compliance with relevant environmental laws. The renewal Permit will allow Wright Patterson to continue to investigate and cleanup any contamination of hazardous waste in the designated areas, or constituents that may be at the facility. Some RCRA regulations have not been authorized in the state of Ohio, therefore U.S. EPA will issue a permit to cover those regulations. Wright Patterson's complete RCRA permit is comprised of both the U.S. EPA and Ohio EPA permits.

**Can I appeal this Permit?**

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

**If I decide to appeal the final Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?**

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than **July 29, 2011**. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. **OHIO EPA ISSUES CLASS 2 MODIFIED HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT**

On June 28, 2011, Ohio EPA issued a modified Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) to Environmental Enterprises, Inc. for its facility at 4650 Spring Grove Ave., Cincinnati, Ohio 45232. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD083377010.

**Why is Environmental Enterprises, Inc. modifying its Permit?**

Environmental Enterprises, Inc. (EEI) is a permitted hazardous waste storage and treatment facility. All waste that comes into the facility is either treated or repackaged and sent off-site to a final disposal or recycling destination. EEI wishes to add five additional hazardous waste codes to their hazardous waste permit. These five codes are: P056, P073, P076, P078, and P095. Addition of these waste codes will not require additional or different management practices from those currently authorized in the permit. EEI will accept these waste codes for storage and transfer only. This final modified permit will allow EEI to make the requested changes. To issue this final modified Permit, Ohio EPA determined that the modification application is complete and meets appropriate standards.

**Can I appeal this final modified Permit?**

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this modified Permit, you have the right to appeal this Permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

**If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?**

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than thirty (30) days after the publication of this notice. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. **OHIO EPA AND U.S. EPA ISSUE DRAFT RENEWAL HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT TO**  
**SOLVAY ADVANCED POLYMERS, LLC**

On June 13, 2011, Ohio EPA and U.S. EPA issued a draft renewal Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation Permit (Permit) to Solvay Advanced Polymers, LLC (Solvay) for its facility located at 17005 State Route 7, Marietta, Ohio 45750. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD981529688.

**Why does Solvay need a Draft Renewal Permit for its Facility?**

Solvay is engaged in the treatment of hazardous waste in a surface impoundment and storage of hazardous waste in containers on-site. The purpose of the renewal permit is to allow Solvay to continue to treat and store hazardous waste at the facility. For the Permit application to receive final approval, Ohio EPA must determine that the Permit application is complete and meets appropriate standards and that the applicant has a history of compliance with relevant environmental laws and demonstrates sufficient reliability, expertise and competency to operate a hazardous waste facility. When issued, the renewal Permit will allow Solvay to continue to treat and store waste in containers. Also, if issued, the renewal Permit will require Solvay to investigate and, if necessary, clean up any contamination from hazardous wastes or constituents that may be at the facility. Some RCRA regulations have not been authorized in the state of Ohio, therefore U.S. EPA must issue a permit to cover those regulations. Solvay's complete RCRA permit is comprised of both the U.S. EPA and Ohio EPA permits.

**When and where will Ohio EPA hold a Public Meeting?**

A public meeting will be held on Thursday, July 14, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. at the Washington County Public Library, 615 Fifth Street, Marietta, Ohio 45750 to receive public comments. Oral comments will be received during the public meeting. All persons, including the applicant, may submit written comments relating to this draft action. Written comments may be submitted before the end of the comment period to the addresses in the paragraph below. You can submit written comments anytime between June 14, 2011 and July 29, 2011.
