

PUBLIC NOTICE
COVENANT NOT TO SUE/FINAL FINDINGS AND ORDERS
Village of Roseville, Former Brush Pottery Property

Notice is hereby given that on July 21, 2011, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA"), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") Chapter 3746 and Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") Chapter 3745-300, issued a Covenant Not To Sue/Final Findings and Orders to the Village of Roseville, the "Volunteer" for property known as the Former Brush Pottery property (the "Property").

The Volunteer conducted a voluntary action of the approximately 1.65 acre-Property, which is located at 87 Perry Street, Roseville, Perry County, Ohio. A no further action letter for the Property was submitted on May 12, 2011 to the Voluntary Action Program of the Ohio EPA Division of Environmental Response and Revitalization by Mark D. Butler, a Certified Professional as defined in ORC 3746.01(F) and OAC 3745-300-01(A).

This action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (the "Commission") pursuant to ORC 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Treasurer, State of Ohio", which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section. **Public Notice – Amended OAC Rule 3745-17-11
Draft Available for Comment**

Notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC) has prepared draft language for an amendment to rule 3745-17-11 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) related to the control of particulate emissions from industrial sources.

This rule was finalized and became effective on February 1, 2008. This rule was conditionally approved by U.S. EPA into the Ohio SIP on December 27, 2010. In order to obtain full approval Ohio EPA agreed to incorporate an additional change which was documented in U.S. EPA's final Federal Register dated October 26, 2010. This change addresses concerns raised by U.S. EPA regarding paragraph (A)(1)(I) of Ohio's final rule.

Specifically, the following text is added to paragraph (A)(1)(I) of this rule; "... any such exemption approved by the Director must be approved by the U.S. environmental protection agency as a revision of the state implementation plan." This wording is similar to what Ohio EPA has used before in OAC rule 3745-21-09(B)(2) for Director's discretion items in the VOC rules and is agreeable to U.S. EPA. With this proposed amendment U.S. EPA will grant full approval, regarding this rule, to Ohio's revised SIP. Federal Register Volume 75, No. 206, FR 65569-70 provides the full explanation of the needed change.

As part of the rule-making process, DAPC is required by Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code to consult with organizations that represent political subdivisions, environmental interests, business interests, and others affected by the rules. The DAPC is offering your organization the opportunity to comment on these rules before the division formally proposes them.

PUBLIC NOTICE

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of standards and regulations, the Director of the Ohio EPA is public noticing a permit that regulates storm water discharges from the City of Dayton municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) to surface waters of the State on August 4, 2011. The permit will be issued as a final action unless the Director revises it after consideration of comments made in writing or at a public meeting, or upon disapproval by the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Any person may submit written comments on the draft permit for the administrative record. A public meeting may be held to explain the content of the permit and its applicability. The date, time and location of the public meeting will be public noticed if one is to be held.

The permit affords coverage to all areas within the corporate boundary of the City of Dayton served by its MS4 and authorizes existing or new storm water point source discharges to surface waters of the State from the MS4. The permit contains requirements for a storm water management program (SWMP) to reduce pollutant discharges from the MS4. The permit also contains monitoring requirements to identify the impact of the discharges from the MS4 on water bodies and to assess the effectiveness of the SWMP.

All interested persons are invited to submit written comments on the permit. Comments should be submitted no later than 30 days after the date of this public notice. Deliver or mail comments to:
