Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 water quality certification for a project to replace the existing bridge on Vrooman Road over the Grand River with the construction of a new high level bridge along a new alignment between Seely Road and State Route 84, and the construction of a new access road, Adams Road, located east of the proposed new bridge alignment. The application was submitted by the Lake County Engineer. The project is located in Leroy and Perry Townships. The Buffalo District Corps of Engineers Public Notice Number for this project is 2013-01234. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 144408.

As required by the Anti-degradation Rule, 3745-1-05, of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would result in impacts to 0.84 acres of Category 3 wetlands, 90 linear feet of the Grand River, an exceptional warm water habitat stream, 82 linear feet of Borden's Ditch and 99 linear feet of Stream 3, an unnamed tributary to the Grand River. Both Borden's Ditch and Stream 3 are warm water habitat streams. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would result in impacts to 0.49 acres of Category 3 wetlands, 340 linear feet of the Grand River, an exceptional warm water habitat stream, 60 linear feet of Borden's Ditch and 99 linear feet of Stream 3, an unnamed tributary to the Grand River. Both Borden's Ditch and Stream 3 are warm water habitat streams. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state.

Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of the Grand River. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an anti-degradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality. All three proposed alternatives will be considered during the review process. No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by OAC rule 3745-1-05, apply or may be granted.

The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would clear 9.96 wooded acres to construct a 129,980 square foot building, 232,750 square foot truck loading dock and parking expansion, 20 foot wide fire access road, and a 0.94 acre on-site storm water detention basin. This preferred alternative will require filling approximately 5.33 acres of a category 2 forested wetland and 0.07 acres of a category 2 non-forested wetland. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would clear 8.06 wooded acres to construct a 120,000 square foot building, 137,180 square foot truck loading dock and parking expansion, 20 foot wide fire access road, and a 0.40 acre on-site storm water detention basin. This minimal degradation alternative will require filling 4.28 acres of a category 2 forested wetland and a 0.07 acres of a category 2 non-forested wetland. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state.

Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Plum Creek. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32.
