Addressing IDDE

- Individually or
- Joint program lead by the Health District
 - County-wide Spill/Dumping Hotline
 - IDDE regulation to be enacted by the Health District and communities may choose to enter an agreement with the Health District to:
 - Conduct outfall monitoring and/or sampling, and/or
 - Source tracking of identified pollutants, and/or
 - Issue orders and follow-up with enforcement, and/or
 - Public Education and Involvement

IDDE Plan for 2008

- Finalize and implement a Spill/Dumping Hotline
- Identify high risk hotspots through:
 - Outfall monitoring and sampling
 - Land use study
- Creation of a four year budget to focus on source tracking, elimination/enforcement

IDDE Plan for 2008

- Co-Permittees participating in the Health District Program will have to enter MOU's in order to comply with the permit
- The MOU along with the Program Plan will outline responsibilities accepted by the Health District and expected of the Community
- MOU's will also spell out costs.
