## Assistance in a Changing World

Department of Defense organizations are being faced with more challenging pollution prevention (P2) and waste reduction directives from both federal and state levels. Most installation commanders and environmental staffs lack the resources to identify opportunities within their organizations for reductions in the volume or toxicity of waste generated.

The DOD/Federal Facility/Ohio Pollution Prevention Partnership is made up of selected military/federal facilities located in Ohio, Ohio EPA, and U.S. EPA. These representatives meet bimonthly to discuss P2 issues that are particular to DOD installations.

One of the reasons for the development of the DOD P2 partnership was to draw upon the P2 experiences of partnership members and to apply those experiences to other installations for the reduction of the toxicity and volume of pollution being generated.

The partnership offers a Pollution Prevention Opportunity Assessment (PPOA) to DOD installations within the State of Ohio. This is a voluntary program where members of the DOD P2 partnership evaluate the processes occurring on an installation and make recommendations for changes that would reduce the toxicity or the volume of the pollution being generated.

## Services Provided

During the installation site visit, the P2 Partnership will:

- Review current waste management practices
- Assess sources and types of wastes generated
- Identify additional waste management measures
- Discuss feasibility of different options
- Provide checklists and case studies on waste reduction opportunities
- Identify areas for follow-up, if requested

## Program Benefits

This confidential technical assistance program is offered at no cost. The assessment is also non-regulatory in nature and will not focus on compliance with environmental regulations. The P2 assessment will provide information that can be incorporated into the installation Pollution Prevention Plan and to document opportunities that are being performed, but not documented. The report is provided only to the requesting organization.
